

PET EMERGENCIES

The following are conditions in which your should seek immediate vet care

- **SHOCK: SUDDENLY PALE GUMS OR NON RESPONSIVE**
- **HEMORRHAGE (BLEEDING)**
- **BLOATING (DISTENTION OF BELLY)**
- **PERSISTANT VOMITING OR VOMITING BLOOD**
- **SUDDEN INCREASE IN WATER CONSUMPTION**
- **BLOODY DIARRHEA OR DIARRHEA THAT WORSENS OR PERSISTS WITH TIME**
- **LACK OF APPETITE FOR MORE THAN 48 HOURS**
- **HIGH FEVER**
- **CHOKING AND PAWING PERSISTENTLY AT FACE**
- **SUDDEN LAMENESS OR DEVIATION OF BONES**
- **AUTOMOBILE ACCIDENT**
- **UNEXPLAINED SEIZURES**
- **ANYTIME COMMON SENSE TELLS YOU YOUR PET IS DEFINITLY SICK**
